McCrory Africa trip

An African trip planned in 2020 finally came to fruition September 2022. Our two week adventure took us initially to Cape Town, South Africa and then on to Safari experiences in South Africa, Botswana and Zambia. Getting to Cape Town was not an easy journey. It took us on four different airplanes and a total of 43 hours with long layovers at every stop. We decided to leave home an entire day earlier than needed in the event we experienced a missed flight, thankfully which we did not. With a "Free Day" in the wine region east of Cape Town, we lucked into a fabulous Antique Car collection at the Franschhoek Motor Museum. The Museum is owned by Johann Rupert, a South African Billionaire / Global Businessman, and sits on an estate which includes vineyards and a race horse stud farm. Over the years, we have visited many vintage car collections across the world, and put this collection at perhaps the top of the list. They had 80 cars on display, which they rotate throughout the year, but the uniqueness of the cars was spectacular. Each car had a plaque with information on its specifications and history. In addition to the displayed cars, the museum offered the opportunity to be driven around the estate in one of their vintage cars. The car of the day was a 1954 Citreon, right hand drive with the gear shift on the dash.

The rest of our planned itinerary in Africa was equally spectacular. We made it to the Cape of Good Hope, the southwestern most point of the African continent. We did a Malay cooking class in Cape Town. We saw the "Big Five" in addition to many more animals and birds of Africa. And we walked the entire length of Victoria Falls, which required crossing the border into Zimbabwe. We were surprised at how close we got to the animals (from the safety of our safari vehicle) and how much energy is required to ride (bounce) through the bush for 4-8 hours at a time. No one told us that staying in your seat would require so much stamina! We are delighted we have added this trip to our list of life experiences.
