## WOODYISMS

April is in the rearview mirror and we're looking at May the month that signals the unofficial start of Summer. We close out this next one-twelfth portion of our loop around the Sun with Memorial Day. There are plenty of commemorations that take place before that during May and here are a few of them:

May 1 May Day: Marks the halfway point between the first day of [https://www.wincalendar.com/Spring-Begins](https://www.wincalendar.com/Spring-Begins) spring and the [https://www.wincalendar.com/Summer-Solstice](https://www.wincalendar.com/Summer-Solstice) summer solstice. This day can be traced back to the days of the Romans as it involved many pagan rituals and ancient customs. These were slowly phased out with the arrival of Christianity. Festivals, dances, and rituals related to agriculture and fertility were practiced by many Germanic and European countries. May3-Yom HaZikaron: (Israeli Memorial Day) to remember those who gave their lives in defense of the State of Israel. It honors those soldiers who fought in the War of Independence as well as subsequent battles. On the preceding day, a one-minute siren is sounded in the evening. The following morning, a two-minute siren is sounded before a national memorial ceremony is held. The memorial period ends on the evening of May 4th.
May 5-Cinco de Mayo is a celebration of the Mexican Army's victory over France during the French and Mexican War of 1862. The French army marched toward Mexico with the hopes of establishing a second Mexican empire. In the city of Puebla, Mexican General Ignacio Zaragoza was able to successfully beat the French army. Cinco de Mayo commemorates this victory and has been adopted in the US as a celebration of Mexican culture and heritage.
May 7-Kentuckly Derby Day: The Kentucky Derby is one of the oldest horse races in the world. The race is a 1.25 -mile long, horse race for three-year-old thoroughbreds on a dirt track. It is held annually at Churchill Downs racetrack in Louisville, Kentucky. The Kentucky Derby is run on the first Saturday in May of every year and is the first leg of the elusive Triple Crown races. It is followed by the Preakness Stakes two weeks later in Baltimore, Maryland, and the Belmont Stakes, 3 weeks after the Preakness in Elmont, New York.
May8-Mother's Day: The second Sunday in May is set aside to honor and recognize the sacrifices and accomplishments of mothers. This day offers sons, daughters, and anyone with a mother the chance to show their appreciation. Mothers are typically thanked with cards and flowers, breakfast in bed, or by agreeing to do all the household chores. Mother's Day was established in 1914 by US President Woodrow Wilson.
May 21-Armed Forces Day: A Day to recognize members of the Armed Forces that are currently serving. In 1947, the Armed Forces of the US were united under one department which was renamed the Department of Defense. In 1949. President Harry S. Truman supported the creation of a day for the nation to unite in support and recognition of our military members and their families. On August 31, 1949, Secretary of Defense Louis Johnson announced that Armed Forces Day would take the place of other individual branch celebrations, and all branches of the military would be honored on this day. Armed Forces Day is observed annually on the third Saturday in May.
May 30-Memorial Day: Set aside to honor and remember those who died while serving in the military. This day aims to raise awareness about the nation's freedom and the price for that freedom. Every year, U.S soldiers and their families pay that price. Memorial Day is a day for reverence and honoring of those who gave their lives defending the Nation and its values. Congress declared it a national holiday in 1971. It is observed annually on the last Monday of May.
